## Making an Outline

### 1. Select topic

✓ that you feel passionate about

### 2. Important questions:

- ✓ Is there enough research available on this topic?
- ✓ Is the topic new and unique enough that I can offer fresh opinions, new contribution?

### 3. Identify the goal of the paper

✓ core objective/hypothesis

## Making an Outline

- 3. Begin your research
  - ✓ **Data:** Web pages, journal articles, books, academic databases, etc.
- 4. Make an **Outline** (ca. 2-3 pages)
  - ✓ Motivation
  - ✓ Core objective
  - ✓ Method & major data/literature
  - √ Work structure
    - ✓ Discuss your outline with your supervisor
- 5. Write your paper

### 1. Title

✓ select an informative title

### 2. Abstract

- √ summary of your work
- ✓ ca. 300 words
- ✓ Incl. the rationale behind the study, method of approach, major results and conclusions

#### 3. Introduction

- ✓ Motivation
- ✓ Hypothesis, objective
- ✓ Literature (State-of-the-art)
- ✓ Structure of the work

### Methodology

- Describe data used
- ✓ Describe methodology, formal framework (equations, models, etc.)

### 5. Results

- ✓ Goal: to present and illustrate your findings
- ✓ Summarize your findings in text and illustrate them (figure, tables)
- ✓ Describe each of your results
- ✓ Analyse your data
- ✓ Support every statement you make with evidence!

### 6. Conclusion

- ✓ Briefly summarize your findings
- ✓ Answer the question

### 7. References

✓ List all literature cited in your paper
